- ▶ Use your network!
- ▶ Contact the local council
- ▶ Host a one day event



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Program Steps

1. Attend this training and review all resources
2. Identify a key volunteer in your chapter to manage the effort OR individual members can chose to volunteer independently
3. Identify which age level you will want to work with and a troop/group to work with
4. Meet with troop leader to plan out the activities, get meetings scheduled and assign activities to AFWA members. Also identify who will pay for materials
